A comprehensive Internet-based self help System

- Depression
- Anxiety disorders
- Burnout
- Alcohol abuse/dependence

Web-based Screener for Common mental disorders (WSC)

- 22 items
- Depression, anxiety, burnout, alcohol abuse/dependence, etc)
- Screening questionnaire (SQ;Marks et al., 2005)
- E.g. "Have you avoided social situations for fear of being the focus of attention?"

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Background (4)

Is screening through the Internet possible?



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This study:

For different disorders:

- Feasibility and psychometric properties of the WSC
- Comparison to accepted and validated (long) screening questionnaires
- Comparison to diagnoses



Ultimately:

• Leading people correctly to specific selfhelp interventions on the Internet



Design: participants

• Recruitment through banners via the Internet

Inclusion:

- Participants (18 year and older) in the general population
- Written informed consent

Exclusion:

Suicidal participants

Design: procedure

Web based Screener for Common mental disorders (N=215)

Screening questionnaires (e.g. CES-D, HADS, PDSS-SR, Fear Questionnaire (N=215)

Diagnostic telephonic interview (CIDI 2.1) (N=46)

Currently

- Oct, 1/2007:
- 475 Participants (target: 740)
- 88 Diagnostic interviews (target: 250)
- 25% Dropout
- Inclusion period: may-dec 2007

Preliminary results (1)

Demographic characteristics (N=215)

102 Males (47.4%) 113 females (52.6%)
Higher education n=95 (44.2%)
Age, M (SD)= 46 (11.07) range: 22-80

Preliminary results (2)

- WSC Depression:
- Q1) How much are you troubled by feeling miserable or depressed?

Not troubled (0)-quite troubled (4)– quite/seriously troubled (5)- very seriously troubled (7)

 Q2) Do you experience a loss of interest and/or pleasure in things you normally do enjoy?

Yes/No

WSC positive: Q1>=4 or Q2=yes

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Preliminary results (3) Depression (N=215, CIDI diagnoses n= 46)

Screener Gold Sensitivity Specificity AUC standard WSC .98 **CES-D** .735 .49 WSC MDD 1.00 .17 .586 CES-D MDD 1.00 .28 .638

WSC: Q1>=4 or Q2=yes CES-D=>16

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


WSC*: Q1>=5 & Q2=yes CES-D=>22

WSC: Q1>=5 & Q2=yes CES-D: =>22

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Conclusion (3)

- 2 questions of the WSC are similar to the 20 questions of the CES-D
- Almost all of the depressive people are correctly assigned to the self help module for depression
- Over treatment of non depressive people

Discussion

- N (46) is small
- People report more symptoms online than with paper-pencil version
- Time gap between screening questionnaire and diagnostic interview
- No knowledge of other diagnoses
- Over treatment: acceptable?

Future analyses

Psychometric properties of:

- Web-based Screener for Common mental disorders (WSC)
- Screening Questionnaires (CES-D, HADS, PDSS-SR etc)
- Different cut off points

Compared to: Diagnosis of depression, anxiety disorders, burnout alcohol abuse/dependence,
